Dear Parents,

We are studying Laws and Values in Social Studies and continue to study biographies of the great men and women of the past and present. This project will take the place of most homework during the next two weeks. The research reports are due on ______.

We have been looking at people who have made a difference, people that we view as heroes. We will be defining a hero as a person admired for achievements, qualities, or courage. We also discussed how many heroes have had to overcome great obstacles to reach their goals.

Attached you will find a planning sheet for your child's hero research. Remember this is a <u>planning</u> sheet. It does need to be filled out. Your child will use the information from this sheet to assist him/her in creating a written report. Please help your child remember the report must be in their own words.

There will also be a visual required. This can be a poster, a collage, a PowerPoint, or even a diorama. The report will be presented orally in class, so make sure your child takes the time to practice reading through the project before trying to present it. If it is in his/her own words it will be readable to him/her, however, if it is simply a direct copy your child may experience difficulty with the presentation.

I have also included some ideas for research starters. You are welcome to do any of these or anyone else you believe to be a hero. Remember on the planning sheet it does request your information source so it must be researched.

I hope you enjoy this. As I look over the names on the list I remember learning about many of them myself and I truly cherish the value lesson that reading about them taught me. I hope your child will someday look back on this and think the same.

Please have fun with this project as you and your child learn together!
